Lachlan Olive, teacher from Killara High School who visited with the students last Monday night, sent this report on MUNA for our members. He also said "once again, thank you so much for giving our wonderful kids this great opportunity."

Ku-ring-gai Rotary Club sponsored a team from Killara High School to participate in the annual Model United Nations Assembly in May this year. The students in this team were allocated the country of Iraq and so were expected to represent Iraq's interests in a series of debates. The six resolutions that were debated, amended and in some cases passed covered topics as diverse as climate change, protection of trade routes, refugees and whether Twitter is the most appropriate forum in which to conduct international diplomacy.



The event is held over a weekend, and all students in this team first committed themselves to sacrificing mornings in which to research Iraq's stance on these issues and then attending the event as well. From their experience, the students gained a deeper appreciation of the workings of the United Nations, the diverse range of opinions that can be held on the issues that were debated, and an opportunity to further their public speaking skills. Students are also encouraged to adopt national costume to further their understanding of different peoples and customs.
