Youth Service Turramurra and Ku ring gai

Joy and Greg attended the dual launch of Turramurra Youth Service and Ku-ring-gai Youth Council on Wednesday afternoon. The Youth Centre is located behind Turramurra Library. The Rotary Club of Turramurra had donated \$3500 to help get it up and running, as well as many hours of cleaning, painting, building cupboards and fitting it out etc. It is open between 3.30 and 6.30pm on Wednesdays and Thursdays for young people to socialise, study, play games, as well as enjoying special events such as DJ workshops, arts and crafts and music nights. The centre also provides information on drugs and alcohol, sexual health, legal aid and employment.

Ku-ring-gai Youth Council was launched and Joy said the young school students who spoke were very impressive. Amongst other things, they want to see young people have more community spirit and be more involved in their local community.

Jason Guest, Youth Services Co-ordinator at Ku-ring-gai Council, is keen to talk with our Youth Committee about our Club participating in a local project for young people.

Youth Insearch is an amazing organisation founded 25 years ago to empower young people to take control of their lives, by giving them the opportunity and skills to develop their self-esteem and play a positive role in society.

Youth Insearch's success is build on providing peer-to-peer support, utilising the experience of extensively trained young people, who support and guide other young people. They annually organise 6 weekend programs where 65 people between 12 and 17 years old from all different backgrounds and cultures participate in what for a lot of them will be a life changing event. To help support Youth Insearch in running these special weekends we are looking for volunteers who can help with catering duties over the weekend of 18-20 February, 2011. Ideally we need 6-8 people there each day.

It doesn't matter how well you can cook, the most important thing is that you are happy to help YiS to continue with their highly successful weekend programmes.

• Rotary Foundation Thought for The Week

This week's Rotary Foundation Thought is about Foundation Alumni.

Rhoderick Samonte knows what it's like not to be able to afford an education. When the Philippine student was accepted into a master's program at Brandeis University but didn't have the money to attend, when he learned of The Rotary Foundation's Scholarships Fund Pool for Low-Income Countries, two days before the application deadline. He applied and was named an Ambassadorial Scholar for 2004-06.

"My belief in service has been reinforced by my involvement with Rotary," Samonte says. "Education is not just a privilege. It is a call to serve."

In 2006, Samonte was tempted to stay in the United States after he finished his degree, but he knew it was his responsibility to return home and help people there.
