Last Monday's guest speaker was Mike Clarey, newly elected President of Killara Golf Club, accompanied by the General Manager David Gazzoli.

This was the first time the Golf Club has been represented at our dinner meeting.

Mike & David enjoyed pre-dinner chats with our members and spoke of the Golf Club's role in meeting the challenges of the general downward trend in golf playing public, the community perceptions of golf, and the need to restructure the club to be relevant in a changing world.

With many golf courses on public land battling to justify their limited use of public land, Killara G C is fortunate to be on private land with some freedom to plan ahead. The recent difficulties at Gordon Golf Club are an example of such a problem.

Killara G C's approach is to establish a 'country club' style of facility, including current massive expenditure on upgrading the course fairways and greens to be among top 50 in Australia.

The next step is to appoint a project manager group to reconfigure the club house buildings, with the blessing of Council, State Planning, club members and local community.

Mike and David expressed interest in our Club activities and the opportunity to come together on community projects of mutual interest. Our Board will work on a plan for these discussions.
