THE GIRL WHO KICKED THE HORNET'S NEST is the third and final film adaptation of the best-selling Millennium trilogy written by the late Swedish author, Stieg Larsson (The Girl With the Dragon Tattoo and The Girl Who Played With Fire).

In this last installment, Lisbeth Salander (Noomi Rapace) lies in critical condition, a bullet wound to her head, in the intensive care unit of a Swedish city hospital. 33) This week's Rotary Foundation Thought is about a Rotary World Peace Fellow at work on the frontlines.

Izabela Pereira, a 2007 graduate of the Rotary Centre for International Studies at Universidad del Salvador in Argentina, helped monitor Nicaragua's 2008 election as part of an Organisation of American States (OAS) mission to the country. Izabela says her experience as a Rotary World Peace Fellow and an OAS observer gave her a firsthand understanding of how democracy is being promoted and strengthened in Nicaragua. She has also conducted field-work in Senegal and Cote d'Ivoire for the United Nations Development Fund for Women.

Izabela is one of 110 annually, Rotary World Peace Fellows who have received the training and field experience necessary to work for lasting peace and stability throughout the world.
