Four years ago Matt commenced the development of A WEB for those interested in bush walking and the site now has 950 walks. He gets up to 4,000 visits per day in peak periods and averages 2.000 per dav

Matt see areas preserved and explored in a sustainable way

Matt has written 3 books, The Central Coast, Snowy Mountains and the Great North Walk

Matt said walks need to be planned so you do "not call for help when the sun sets unexpectedly", also a long walk inspires people

The Great North walk is one of the best known long distance walks in NSW. The track was formally established in 1988 as a bicentennial project and is now managed by the NSW Lands Department. The whole walk stretches from the City of Sydney to Newcastle. The walk travels through a variety of environments from public roads, National Parks, State Forests, and private farm land. The walk is generally well signposted and follows a clear and maintain track

Some walks are only a few hours and others take much of the day. This is a great way to explore this wonderful walk. The walks in Sydney have great Public Transport access points as do the last few walks through Newcastle. The walks in the middle will require some planning for transport, but it is well worth the little effort.

The walk has been arranged in 40 Segments and can be done at different times or day by day

Sydney to Thornleigh via Lane Cove Tourist Park

Wondabyne station to Somersby Store overnight

Somersby to Yarramalong via Stringy Bark Point

Yarramalong to Watagan Creek via Basin Campsite

Watagan Creek road to Congewai Valley east track head

Congewai east track head to Watagan Forest Motel via Forestry HQ campsite

Heaton Gap to Teralba station

Teralba to Newcastle via Glenrock Scout Camp

40) This week's Rotary Foundation Thought is an update on polio eradication efforts in 2009-10.

Last year saw \$120.2 million allocated to the continued use of new tools and the development of new tactics that led to a reduction of polio cases and despite an outbreak in Tajikistan and Central Africa, further reduced the number of notifications. There are new commitments from country leaders and a new Case for Completing Polio Eradication, but the Global Polio Eradication Initiative faces a significant funding challenge. We need Rotarians' ongoing commitment to eradicate Polio. **Your support is vital in finishing the job!** Rotary has contributed \$165 million of the \$200 million Polio Challenge, which is matched \$ for \$ by the Gates Foundation.
