The District's next visiting Group Study Exchange team is coming from District 1260, England, an area north of London, mostly Hertfordshire, including centres such as Wendover, Luton, Stevenage. and Aylesbury. This is a single vocation exchange - this year it is "media". The "incomings" work as a reporter for a local paper, press officer for the Hertfordshire Constabulary, charity communications officer, and local council communications officer.

They arrive in Sydney on **Sunday March 4, 2012**, and will be visiting clubs and the District Conference from **Monday March 5 to Saturday March 31**.

They will be in the care of the District zones - which include your club - Upper North Shore, Peninsula and Northern District - from **Sunday March 11 to Thursday, March 15**. District takes them to Wollongong on **Friday March 16**. I am the co-ordinator for this part of their visit to our three zones. I am a member of the Rotary Club of Wahroonga. Address and contact numbers are at the end of this email.

Later I will be seeking home-hosting for these young and active people, but at the moment the urgent need is to line up vocational visits for them. They each have a long and ambitious "wish list" of things they wish to study (besides beaches, nature parks and the Harbour Bridge). These are attached, as well as the team photo.

Could I suggest that you trawl through the "wish list" and see if there's anything there that some, or several, of your members could help with. Then, those members could **contact me** as soon as possible with their thoughts (a draft list has to be with the Rotary Foundation by November 30 but I hope this will be elastic).

Could you also pass all this information on to your club bulletin editor, as I'm anxious to prepare the way for events such as a presentation night at one of our clubs and home-hosting.
