Brief Background on Rob Byrne

Rob grew up in Castlecove in Sydney's north. After completing degrees in Economics and Business Administration, Rob spent 25 years as an executive in the IT industry.

Subsequently, he had a 'tree change' and moved to Grafton on the NSW North Coast where, for ten years, he ran a successful online business and bred rare horses.

In early 2011, he sold his horses, property and business with a view to riding his recumbent bicycle throughout Australia to raise funds and awareness for Rotary's End Polio Now program. So far he's raised over \$60,000. He has now moved back to Sydney's North Shore where lives with his partner, Ulli.

Rob is 60 and has three adult children.

## Graeme Davies Guest Speaker

Graeme introduced Conflict resolution and he asked for 3 members to join a role play which will bring in mental issues. The discussion is based on De Bono's six hats of conflict

A different coloured hat is assigned and you need to talk about the colour of your hat

Rotary has been a major leader in the de stigmatization of mental health. Australian Rotary Health has raised \$37m for research in mental health

The role play is a Rotary Board President Secretary and Membership development

The item on the agenda occurred at the meeting last week, Angus drank too much and caused problems. Malcolm objected and said that Angus was drunk and racist. Chris said that Angus caused problems at the electoral office. Bob who is membership officer objected that he had not been told and also that Angus funded a major project last year  
President Lynn suggested that the problem should be discussed by the club.  
White Hat De Bono's Six Thinking Hats

### The White Hat

The White Hat calls for information known or needed. They need additional information before a decision can be taken to expel him from Rotary. They need to be cautious and seek information from his spouse to assist Angus

### The Red Hat

The Red Hat signifies feelings, hunches and intuition  
Angus and the club need help and they wonder if he has a friend in Rotary who may know is he has always been the same or has changed recently

### The Black Hat

The Black Hat is judgment -- the devil's advocate or why something may not work.  
The proposer wants him expelled without due cause, maybe he was ill or on medication. What are the rules for expulsion? He may have a mental problem and needs help

### The Yellow Hat

The Yellow Hat symbolizes brightness and optimism.  
We need to defend Angus and the name of Rotary. The convener knows him and he needs a private discussion to point out the significant assistance he has given to Rotary, We suggest he needs and anger management course and we are prepared to accompany him to a course.

### The Green Hat

The Green Hat focuses on creativity: the possibilities, alternatives and new ideas.

They thought there are 2 problems, mental health and alcohol. They recommend that some members have a discussion with Angus and offer assistance. Another idea is to change his role in the club and ask him to report weekly to keep him focused and alert. We should consider turning our club into a breakfast club where we would not have alcohol

### The Blue Hat

The Blue Hat is used to manage the thinking process.

The scenario was based on a real issue and many of the issues we discussed were used
