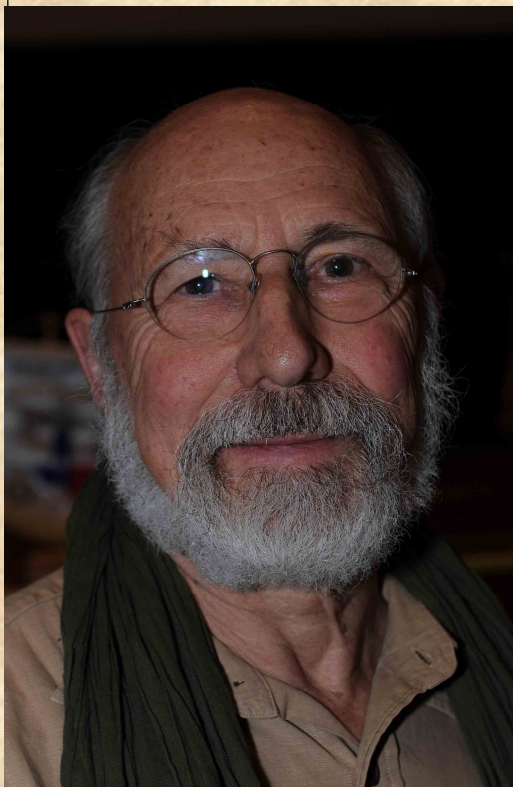
I hope this is something we can continue in the future and I would also be keen to promote participation in any events organised by the other clubs in our zone, whether this be joint fundraisers, or community projects.

## Richard Green Photographer

Richard Green started as a salesman and then went to University and became a Physicist

He majored in Computer Graphics starting with Punch cards and then progressed to Telex machines

He then started developing seminars in Computer Graphics and after a series of successful events and building a staff of 100 he sold it to a public company and retired comfortably at age 47

His accountant took him for a ride in a Helicopter and he was hooked

He decided to take up the challenge of learning to fly a helicopter. and subsequently purchased his own, and emigrated to Australia where he met Carolyn. For over 20 years they have made regular helicopter trips together to distant and otherwise inaccessible outback locations - their objective being to find and photographically record some of the continent's most remote, wild and beautiful environments.

The helicopter has been specially modified to act as a self-sufficient camp base. This allows him to remain in situ to take photographs in the warm light of dawn or sunset. Details can be found in their book REMOTE & WILD

His photographs are usually up to 10 shots of a panorama up to 220 degrees and he then spends up to nine hours on a computer realigning to a single flat image

The helicopter was made in Germany the tail rotor is in a window and enclosed he has a long range fuel tank and a freezer and has removed 5 seats and filled the rear with equipment he needs 8 fuels stops Sydney to Darwin.

He usually flies at 9000 feet and this is an opportunity for excellent photography

He has exhibited in the National Gallery and the exhibition is now touring regional Australia

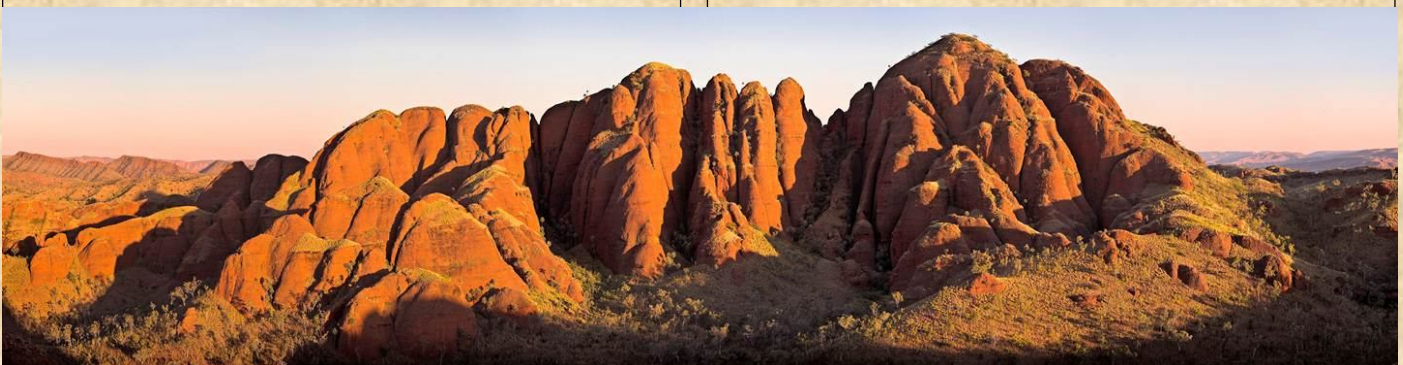
Being fortunate enough to own and being able to fly their own helicopter provides an opportunity to get to the most inaccessible places. The majority of his landscape photographs are taken in some of the wildest and most remote wilderness areas on the continent.

Apart from their love of being out in the wilderness and the artistic challenge of creating the images, there is a more serious side to their work. Debate about climate change and its inevitable impact continues to stimulate discussion.

They are extremely concerned by the lack of real action from governments, and feel that there is an urgent need for public pressure to be brought to bear on our politicians to make courageous and long-sighted decisions. Regardless of any doubts on the matter, there is no margin for error as wrong decisions or inaction will be irretrievable.

They hope that their images will add to the growing public awareness of the beauty of our natural environment and encourage and support the desire to protect it.
