

Youth Insearch

Joy thanked members who had volunteered for the garage sale and working bee on 8 September at Kurrajong. Some of you who have helped with catering for Youth Insearch camps will remember Ron Carr, a Rotarian from Tamworth who is a great supporter of Youth Insearch. Ron was nominated for Father of the Year and this article (by Kitty Hill) appeared in The Northern Daily Leader in Tamworth on 1 September, with a photo of Ron and Myriam Brown with the following caption: "Myriam Brown got her first hug from her youth support worker Ron Carr at age 14, and says he's become a real father figure to her."

A MAN who says he's been blessed to play dad to thousands of children, plus his own, says he's looking for just one gift tomorrow for Father's Day – a big bear hug from his favourite "daughter".

Ron Carr has been delivering care, love and support to many through his years of helping Tamworth and district's needy children as a volunteer support person for Youth Insearch program and says he remembers the day 18-year-old Myriam Brown came into his life. "She must have thought, 'who's this old man?'," Mr Carr said.

"I just wrapped her up and gave her a big hug." It was the first hug that Myriam had received in her young, troubled life. She was at breaking point when she met Ron through the program, close to suicide and with severe anger management and trust problems. "Life was hell for me at age 14, but then I met Ron," Myriam said.

"He's been there for me since he came into my life. He's the father I never had."

Mr Carr, who is also a father to three grown men and has seven grandchildren, said he was never blessed with a daughter, but Myriam had taken the place of one. Myriam has remained in close contact with Ron since they first met and is now considered a permanent part of the Carr family, even spending last year's Christmas day with her adopted family.

Recently celebrating her 18th birthday, and with a new chapter beginning in her life, Myriam has passed on the good fortune, becoming a Youth Insearch program leader in 2010.

She now has a move to Sydney next week, and plans to help other teenagers like herself. She also wants to study psychology.

"She's made these marvellous changes and put the past right behind her. It was so rewarding to help her and now the sky is the limit for her," Ron said.

Ron will spend Father's Day tomorrow surrounded by 70 children on a camp with the youth program, and says his own boys don't mind sharing him around. "I've got a lot of love to give."

Presentation on Humanitarian Project at Ban Xai, Xiengkhouang Province, Lao PDR Leading to a RAWCS approval sponsored by Mosman Rotary for a WATER Project in Laos.

Back ground. MiVAC Trust is a 10 Year old NGO and have been clearing Mines - UXO and Mines - in Laos for 5 years.

The Location of Ban Xai [BX] Village is 30 km from Phonsavan (East on Highway 7). Phonsavan is 1 hour flight from Vientiane going North to Xiengkhouang Province. Hinmou Peung [HP] (part of BX) is 9 km south of BX.

APPROVED OPERATIONAL PERMIT FOR BAN XAI INCLUDES

Phase 1 To construct a facilities building to house a Medical Clinic, a kitchen, a training room and accommodation.

Phase 2 To improve: sanitation, water supply and health programs. To produce methane gas by using animal dung which then is re-used in market gardens. To develop income generation and assist with schools. Phase 3 To assist Ban Xai village in on-going development and to transfer the assets to the village. To repeat the process of Phase 1 and 2 with another village.

The following areas involve water and will be addressed in this current MiVAC project:

1. The supply of water to the Western end of the village

2. Bio-filters in every house to purify the water which is currently done with boiling water with the consequences of denuding the country side of timber.

3. The supply of water to each toilet that MiVAC provided – approximately 103 houses

4. Water supply to the facilities building in BX and HP

- 5. Wells in HP
- 6. Concrete water storage tanks in HP
- 7. The carting of water from delivery outlets to individual homes
