NUMBER TWO MISSIVE FROM EMYR ON HIS TRAV-ELS

I visited Galle by express train just over a week ago, the journey taking just over a couple of hours. Galle's a town of some 85,000 and is south of Colombo on the south coast of SL. It's been occupied at various times by Portuguese, Dutch as well as the British. The old town or Fort occupies most of the south pointing promontory and you can walk around it in just over an hour. It's well worth doing as the views inland and out to sea are quite spectacular and inside there are some quite spectacular buildings.

Seeing that I'm not a tourist I hurry back to let you know that I'm now really well settled into the business of examining music candidates for Trinity College London. The majority have been low grade pianists with but a sprinkle of electronic keyboards and some very welcome respectable young singers full of developing voices and lively faces.

It just so happens that I was delegated to do a day's worth of examining in Kandy some 100ks eastwards which itself has featured prominently as an important SL town. I expanded the day to include the weekend and more, and with a colleague and his wife who arrived a few days ago was able to explore the Royal Botanic Gardens, a very tidily maintained extensive luxuriant area. And I was in good company because I cold have trodden the same bit of turf as Tsar Nicholas and Yuri Gagarin each of whom had 'planted' a tree in the Gardens.

So now I'm back to being a tourist with my driver Anton who transported me around when I visited SL nine years ago. I've been to a tea plantation where I drank white tea, visited a factory producing the most wonderful furniture much of it destined to Australia whilst today I've climbed the spectacular rock fortress of Sigiriya and probably shed a gram or in doing so.
