

# NUMBER FOUR MISSIVE FROM EMYR ON HIS TRAVELS

Am I going to catch the last post before Tony hangs up his biro for the Christmas break I ask myself?

Well here goes anyway. I'm back to 8am departures and 5.30pm returns now. I'm in Goa, the smallest of the Indian states and situated on the west coast and well south of Mumbai. Goa reverted to India in 1961 after centuries under Portuguese rule.

I'm staying in a luxurious resort of some 260 rooms where a short stroll takes you to a very long beach and you can then refresh in the salt water of the Arabian Sea. Rather curiously, to me anyway, I've found that the majority of the people staying here are Russians.

After discussing this with my Goan driver he tells me that most of the resorts along this very kilometres long beach are occupied by Russians. Few of them speak much English and at meal times with the young Goan waiters unable to speak much English either there's a lot of misunderstanding and some miming going on! I myself asked yesterday for a serviette/you know napkin/wiping my mouth thing and the young waiter went off to the kitchen to ask the manager what I needed.

The majority of the candidates I'm examining are either singers, pianists or electronic keyboard players and it's getting to be quite gruelling after too long on the road.

I leave here on Friday 21xii and travel via Mumbai and Kuala Lumpur to Sabah where I've been invited by a lovely Chinese/Malaysian family to stay Christmas. I'd had some problems with getting flights because of the changes I'd had to make anyway so that invite was timely and very welcome.

Hoping that this will get to you soon I'll wish all friends a joyous Christmas and a wonderful 2013. And have a good Christmas party on Monday too.

#### **Rita Coenen Quilts**

Rita is one of the quilters who has been making quilts for Australian Defence Force personnel who are stationed in Afghanistan. There are a number of ladies throughout the country who make these quilts which are then sent overseas to various military personnel on duty to remind them that their commitment is appreciated. Each quilt costs about \$75-\$100 in materials - and the quilters then put in 8-20 hours to make them up. They either pay for the materials themselves or gather donations to pay for the materials which they usually buy locally (and on sale). The completed quilts are then bundled up and sent through the ADF postal process. Where they have some information about the recipient, they will try to "tailor" the quilt around the personality / interests of the person. At last count, there have been over 898 sent out. Rita has contributed 15 so far this year.

This is a great program.... If someone knows someone who has a fabric shop and who would like to help the program by donating / discounting excess fabric to this effort, it would be most appreciated. Obviously, all donations to the organisation are cheerfully received.

Here are some examples of Aussie Hero Quilts. BTW, currently these quilts are just going (or supposed to be going) to service personnel in Afghanistan. But we have personnel doing similar things in other parts of the world. It is more a matter of logistics - quilters, material, post office process etc. than anything else which precludes more service personnel in other theatres of operation getting the benefit. Imagine if all the quilters that Rotary in Aus could turn loose. They probably would have every overseas- active serviceman / woman with a quilt in about 3 months. Look at the inscription on each of the quilts - it reads the same for everyone.
