Let's have a good turnout to meet the members of our partners in the Bobbin Head Cycle Classic project.

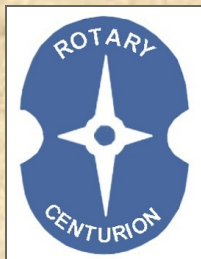
Our substitute Hat Day postponed

Rotary Centurion program

The Centurion Program is the Australian program that helps people to support the great work of the Rotary Foundation, Rotary's own charity. It gives Rotarians, friends and family an opportunity for personal giving of a tax deductible donation of \$100 for as long as you choose.



Donors receive a receipt from the Australian Rotary Foundation Trust and we can each make a choice to have the donation automatically debited to our credit card or to renew each year.

What happens to the money? Your contribution becomes part of the District Annual Giving Program which

means that half of your \$100 comes back to support District Foundation programs that support our club's activities.

New Centurions receive a Centurion badge when they join and renewal reminders are sent out soon after the start of the new financial year.

In the next few weeks Graham Timms will be pestering you to become a Centurion. It's important. Over the years our club has received many District and Foundation grants to carry out our projects – in fact far more than we have contributed.

All you have to do is fill out the form that he will give you. It's as simple as that.

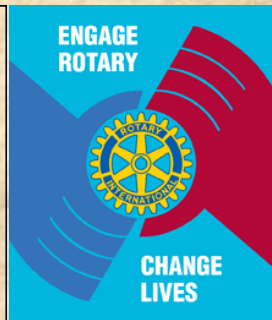

Ross Lambert Club Facebook page

Our scheduled speaker being indisposed, Ross Lambert stepped in at short notice to talk about the club's proposed Facebook page. Ross gave a short demonstration of Facebook

and made these points, amongst others:

- Facebook is the biggest business in the world. The club needs to be involved with it.
- Social media, including Facebook, has enormous usage and reach.
- 90% of people trust personal recommendations (e.g., 'liking' of Facebook pages). Only 14% of people trust advertisements.
- 1,500 'likes' have a potential reach of perhaps 500,000 people, thus getting messages out far more effectively than ordinary advertising.
- The club needs to be on Facebook to attract younger members.
- If the club can create interest in itself and its projects through use of social media, its membership will increase.
- The Facebook page will require interesting content in order to attract others.
- It is essential that members keep the Facebook page up to date and 'alive'.
- Currently only 9 members have Facebook pages.
- Facebook will only work for the club if the great majority of members actively participate in it by posting information on the club's page and 'liking' and commenting on others' posts.

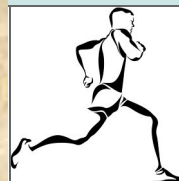
