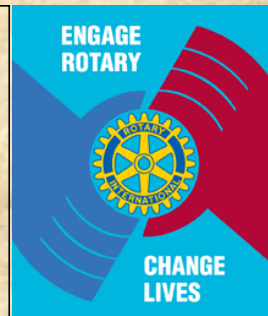

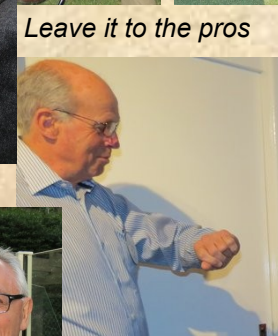

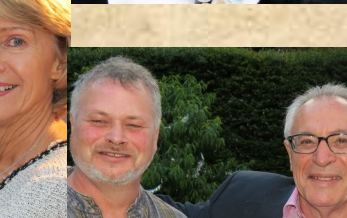
The event included a Melbourne Cup sweep, a putting challenge and a cycling challenge (probably none of which occur in Katuuso).
