TeamMed Nepal Appeal 2016

In the first two weeks of December, 2016 I, along with nine other medical students, a team of porters, trekking guides, translators, one Nepalese doctor and our fearless leader/mentor/advisor Tashi Phuntsok made the trek to the very remote village of Bigu Gompa in order to run a medical campaign. It is a trip that we will never forget and a place I am so fortunate to have visited.

Our trip was organised through TeamMed, a student run body that is associated with the Monash Undergraduate Medical Society and

works to provide global health initiatives primarily through outreach programs to Tonga, Uganda and Nepal, annually. The programs not only seek to provide medical aid in the local communities that have poor access to health facilities but also donate medical supplies and run health promotion programs with the local people.

Team Med works with Himalayan Guge Organisation (HGO), which is an NGO established in 2013 that services the Himalayan region and is based in Kathmandu. HGO's projects are wholly non-profit and are non-political; its primary purpose is to foster and promote health, education, culture and community in the Himalayan region of Nepal. Tashi Phuntsok is the Director of HGO but has been working with the community in Bigu for approximately 10 years and so is someone who knows both the community needs and the individual people at a grassroots level, which is so invaluable when delivering medical aid overseas to help create longevity and sustainability.

As a group we raised exactly \$4571 in total including a very generous combined sponsorship of \$1500 from the Ku-ring-gai and Lindfield Rotary clubs. The money we raised went towards paying for the medications that stocked our clinic, the wage for the Nepalese Doctor who mentored us, banners and print outs for our health promotion strategy, a donation to the nunnery where

we stayed for the entirety of the clinic with the remaining being donated to HGO itself, to help continue their ongoing projects.

Overall Tashi, Dr Pravat and our team agreed that the clinic was a huge success. It ran for four days and serviced 165 patients from the village of Bigu and surrounding villages. The most common conditions that presented were joint pain, gastritis, reflux and sore, dry eyes. We faced a couple of challenges along the way, but none that have not been discussed and we will attempt to rectify for this years trip.

This year I will be applying for the role of Team Med Nepal Trip Coordinator and so hopefully can have a bigger input in some of the bigger decisions that the team makes. I intend to create a fundraising subcommittee to streamline the fundraising process, become more involved in HGO's current major project, that is, building a permanent health clinic in Bigu to service the village and surrounding region and to create and foster a relationship with the Days for Girls Campaign and Teammed in an attempt to bring that organisation to the communities we visit not only in Nepal but in Tonga and Uganda as well.

I look forward to the year coming, my role in TeamMed and hopefully a continued relationship with the Kur-ring-gai rotary club in helping this cause.

Foundation named World's Outstanding for 2016

The [Association of Fundraising Professionals](#) has recognized The Rotary Foundation with its annual Award for Outstanding Foundation.

The award honors organizations that show philanthropic commitment and leadership through financial support, innovation, encouragement of others, and involvement in public affairs. Some of the boldest names in American giving — Kellogg, Komen, and MacArthur, among others —are past honorees.

“We are honored to receive this recognition from the AFP, which gives us even more reason to celebrate during our Foundation’s centennial year,” says Rotary Foundation Trustee Chair Kalyan Banerjee. “The continued strong support of Rotary members will help us keep our promise of a polio-free world for all children and enable the Foundation to carry out its mission of advancing world understanding, goodwill, and peace. We look forward to another 100 years of Rotary members taking action to make communities better around the world.”

The announcement came on 15 November, known to industry professionals since the 1980s as National Philanthropy Day. The award will be presented in early 2017 at the AFP’s annual conference in San Francisco.

Rotary Foundation Trustee Chair-elect Paul Netzel is set to accept the award on Rotary’s behalf, and Eric Schmelling, director of fund development at Rotary, will speak at the conference. The event is expected to draw more than 3,400 senior-level fundraising professionals from 33 countries.

“While almost everyone is familiar with Rotary, not everyone may realize just how much of an impact Rotary and The Rotary Foundation have had on countless people and communities across the globe,” says Jason Lee, AFP president and CEO. “On behalf of the entire charitable sector and people around the world, all of us at AFP are honored to be able to recognize The Rotary Foundation as our 2016 Outstanding Foundation.”

AFP’s committee of judges cited Rotary’s comprehensive campaign to eradicate polio as a major driver of the selection. They also mentioned that Rotary applies a methodical, purposeful approach to support a wide variety of causes, from providing clean water to educating the next generation of peace professionals.

Gemma is the Founder and driving force behind St Jude's and set up the school in 2002. She loves her family her husband, Richard Sisia, and their four children Nathaniel, Jakob, Isabella and Louisa. Gemma was the only daughter of Sue and Basil Rice and was raised alongside seven brothers on a fine wool sheep station outside of Armidale in the New England Tablelands.

At 22 years of age, Gemma set off to Africa to teach maths, science and sewing to girls in Kalangu, a rural village in the middle of Uganda. While in East Africa, she saw how children, families and communities were crippled by a lack of education. Later, her father-in-law, gave her land on which to build her school in Arusha, Tanzania. The school started in 2002 with three students, and today has grown to provide an education to over 1,800 of the poorest children from the local region.

Gemma and St Jude's supporters have tirelessly fundraised so the school can provide a quality education to the poorest of the poor. Gemma's mottos are to fight poverty through education and that education is a right not a privilege.
